MEDICAL ALERTS/COURT ORDERS

Student and staff safety is always a priority. We will begin practicing fire



drills starting this week. Parents please take the time to talk to your children about "Stranger Danger".

If your child has a medical alert or if there is a court order in effect, please ensure the office is informed immediately. Staff are not permitted to administer non-prescription medications to students. In order for us to administer prescription medication, a form must be completed by a Doctor. Students with anaphylaxis are required to have 2 epipens at school. Again, policies do not allow us to administer Benadryl and then an epipen if conditions are not improving.

Student Verification Forms. It is important that
parents read and update information on these
forms and return them to the school office ASAP.

PUBLIC HEALTH NURSE

MSES has a new public health nurse who retrained all staff last week on anaphylaxis and administering epipens. She is available to provide information

and referrals for things such as: common childhood diseases, nutrition, immunization, growth and development, hearing, vision, dental, injury prevention, puberty and much more. Our PAC will be starting their annual Magazine Fundraiser very soon. This fundraiser supports




various school programs that enrich the learning of all MSES students. Magazine subscriptions make a great Christmas Gift. More information, along with catalogues will be sent home with students later this week.

HEAD LICE

Head lice is a nuisance and invariably shows up at school. It is important that we are all responsible in treating cases of head lice. If your child has head lice, please, treat them appropriately and contact the school, so that we can notify other families in the class to also check and treat, if necessary, their children's heads. Confidentiality and dignity of students/families will always be maintained.

BUS TRANSPORTATION (Policy 1118.1)

Many of our students ride school buses each day. Parents please ensure your child knows their bus route and number and are at the bus stop at least 5 minutes prior to the scheduled departure. Students who are eligible for bus transportation, register with

the bus driver at the time they get on the bus and not with the school.
